Bauckham presents a tour de force of argumentation against the 20th-century liberal theory of form criticism, which theorized that the Gospels were based only on the oral traditions of anonymous communities that developed constantly evolving, free-floating stories about Jesus's life, for the purpose of suiting their contemporary needs rather than preserving genuine history. Bauckham proposes instead a reevaluation of the Gospels as the testimony of eyewitnesses to Jesus' ministry.

It is the contention of this book that, in the period up to the writing of the Gospels, gospel traditions were connected with named and known eyewitnesses, people who had heard the teaching of Jesus from his lips and committed it to memory, people who had witnessed the events of his ministry, death, and resurrection and themselves had formulated the stories about these events that they told.
